Membership in ASE is open to individuals who have completed at least one orbit of the Earth in a spacecraft. ASE member countries include Afghanistan, Austria, Belgium, Brazil, Bulgaria, Canada, China, Costa Rica, Cuba, Czech Republic, Denmark, France, Germany, Hungary, India, Israel, Italy, Japan, Kazakhstan, Malaysia, Mexico, Mongolia, Netherlands, Poland, Romania, Russia, Saudi Arabia, Slovakia, South Africa, South Korea, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Syria, Ukraine, United Kingdom, United States, and Vietnam.

The ASE Mission is to apply the unique perspective of our astronaut/cosmonaut members to promote the global benefits of space science, exploration and international cooperation; to educate and inspire future generations; and to foster better stewardship of our home planet.

ASE supports the Net Zero Space goal "to ensure safe space operations and the long-term sustainability of outer space activities." This includes "avoiding further generation of hazardous space debris, and by remediating existing hazardous space debris."
